


### **'Abstracts' BOS shotmaker extols artistic B&Ws** By PAUL SEYMOUR

As a child growing up, I was taught black and white photography in the darkroom by my father, Jim Spencer. I consider him to be a monochrome master. He taught me the basics of black and white



photography.

As the digital revolution arrived, I found myself doing less black and white photography but I've attempted to specifically address black and whites lately. I perceive that there is a lack of artistic black and white photography in today's digital environment.

I was brainstorming one Sunday afternoon, trying to fight a serious case of photographer's block when I came upon an opportunity for my entry in the "abstract" competition for July. I was washing dishes in the kitchen when I noticed the refraction pattern of the Venetian blinds behind the glass pitcher I was washing.

This image shattered my "block" and sent me scrambling for my tripod and camera.

I positioned the camera to maximize the refracted image. I shot the photo using my Canon XTi with a Canon 35 mm to 135 mm zoom lens set at 130 mm and f/25. The ISO was 100, and the shutter speed was 2 seconds. No filters were used. In addition, I realized that the crispness of the refracted lines was critical to the impact of the photo. Therefore, I utilized mirror lock-up and an infrared remote for shutter release. I greatly appreciate the honor of being awarded Best of Show.

## News photog to explain 'A Step Back in Time' restoration project

Former TIME Magazine photographer Shelly Katz will be the speaker at the Sept. 22 meeting of the Plano Photography Club.

At a previous club meeting, drawing upon his lifelong experiences as a photojournalist for TIME, LIFE and other national magazines, he enlightened the club about the world of photojournalism. He also captivated the audience as keynote speaker at the Gulf Coast Council of Camera Clubs 2007 Annual Conference hosted by the PPC.

His Sept. 22 presentation will feature recent work he has done restoring photographs from the U.S. Library of Congress in preparation for an upcoming nation-wide exhibit titled "A Step Back In Time."

Featuring more than 50 images from the U.S. Library of Congress that have been meticulously restored and reproduced on museum quality, archival, fine art paper, the exhibit presents photographs of the Civil War Period (1860-1870), featuring George N. Barnard • Mathew B. Brady • Sam A. Cooley • Alexander Gardner • James F. Gibson • Timothy H. O'Sullivan and Julian Vannerson.

Also included are photographic visions of the American West (1880-1915), represented by William J. Carpenter • Case & Draper • H. H. Clark • Edward S. Curtis • Charles F. Lummis • Karl E. Moon and Frank A. Rinehart.

Whether you are a Beginner or a Master, the techniques he will demonstrate at this meeting will be of great interest to you for your own work.

## 40-shooter limit established for Oct. 4 model shoot

The response to the Fall Outdoor Model Shoot has been so great that the club has decided to limit the number of participants to 40. You must sign up and pay (\$29 cash or check made out to Plano Photography Club) by the Sept. 22 meeting. Walk-ups will not be allowed. You may e-mail Ken Guthrie (see below) to sign up.

The shoot is from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 4 at the Frisco Heritage Museum & Frisco Junction. Props include the retired steam locomotive shown below. Doors will be opened a few minutes before 10 for a meeting in the auditorium where we will introduce the models and go over rules for the shoot.

We need non-shooting volunteers, members, spouses, friends, etc. starting at 9 a.m. to help with



setting up and running the shoot. The historic building exteriors provide interesting backdrops, but there are no chairs or props for the models. We need rocking or wicker chairs, stools, benches or other vintage furniture and props for use by the models. We need a few folding tables for supplies.

Unlike previous model shoots, members will not be required to supply post-shoot images to the paid models. However, a few *unpaid* models will be working for the experience, and we strongly request, but do not require, that you provide images to these unpaid models.

The club has agreed to provide images to the museum for use in publicity, brochures, etc. All photographers will be required to sign a release and provide images that showcase the museum. You do not need to provide images that are predominantly of the model nor do you need to process the shots. In particular the museum needs images of the interior, and we need volunteers to take interior shots suitable for brochures before the regular shoot. Contact Ken Guthrie if you would like to help.

There will be limited shooting in the interior of the museum using studio lights. We need studio lights for these setups.

Limited parking is allowed in the unpaved lot north of the church. In case of wet weather you may park in the lot next to the Senior Center. You may not park in Babe's Restaurant parking lot or your car may be towed.
