

Tabletop technique with club-owned box helps produce BOS

All elements of this composition, *Waterdrops over Red Gerbera*, named Best of Show in February's 'Open' competition, were intentionally chosen and positioned. That is both the pleasure and pain in doing still-life photography.



My waterdrop setup involved a 3-sided black (foam core) box with framing glass on top. A red Gerbera daisy was placed inside this box on some green wrapping paper (complementary colors). Then I arranged the water drops and monofilament fishing line on the glass (treated with Rain-X). The arrangement and choice of subject, color, drop size, etc. is endless. The most difficult aspect of the technique is choosing a focus point and f-stop (for depth of field inside the drop).

This waterdrop setup has been demonstrated at the club's annual Tabletop Workshops. A "Waterdrop Technique Box" has also been assembled with all necessary instructions and equipment. As a club member, you may borrow this Technique Box for one month and create your own waterdrop images. Contact a club officer for further details.

FLASHing forward: Meet your fellow-PPC members

Editor's Note: This is the first in a planned series of articles introducing PPC members to one another. The interviewer is Bill J. Boyd.

Q. Tell us how long you have lived in Texas and anything else that you think club members would like to know about you. My name is Lance Nail and I am 53. I have lived in the Carrollton area for 51 years. In April of 2008 I became an Ironman triathlete by completing Ironman Arizona. I have enjoyed photography as a hobby for 15 years.

- Q. How long have you been a member of Plano Photography Club (PPC)? Are you a member of any other photo organizations and/or clubs? I have been a member of PPC for about 6 months and I am also a member of DCC and plan on joining PSA.
- Q. Tell us something about your very first camera and how you got interested in photography. My interest in photography began with digital photography and our purchase of a travel trailer. Our family vacations became my national photo shoots. My first digital camera was a Nikon Coolpix 950 (2.1 mega pixels). I then purchased an Olympus C-760 (4.2 mega pixels), and I currently use a Canon Rebel XSI (12.2 mega pixels).
- **Q. What is in your camera bag?** My current equipment is all new due to the fact I just upgraded to the digital SLR. I use a medium size Lowepro back-pack bag. I have a 70mm 300mm zoom, 18mm 55mm

wide angle zoom, and a 50mm macro. I carry multiple SD cards so I can switch out periodically to make sure I never lose all my images.

- Q. What do you like to shoot, how often do you shoot, etc? I have mainly shot nature, landscape and macro. But I am enjoying the camera clubs' monthly categories for competition because it gets me out of my comfort zones.
- Q. Describe any photo shoots and/or photo trips you want to do in 2009. My wife and I are planning a trip this spring to Boston and Maine. We also are going to Big Bend in the near future.
- **Q.** What lens to you use most often? Probably the 70 300mm.
- Q. What software do you use for post-processing your images? .Photoshop Elements 7 and my Wacom tablet.
- Q. Describe any photography highlights, i.e., awards, honors, anything published, etc. I am new to both camera clubs, but I won first place in projected image class at the DCC December meeting and third place in the Monochrome print at the DCC January meeting.
- **Q.** Any photography advice for our club members? Being a relatively new photographer I feel the best advice I can give is always be willing to share your knowledge about photography with anyone interested, because I have been a recipient of this practice and it has been a big help to me.

FLASHBACK
