The Plano Photography Club once again has the opportunity to exhibit framed photographs at the Plano Municipal Center and subsequently at the Plano Convention Centre.

We are scheduled to hang our photographs at the Municipal Center on Tuesday, September 1st and then move them to the Plano Convention Centre on Friday, October 23rd where they will remain until Tuesday, January 5th, 2010.

The photographs should be matted and framed, and a wire extending from one side of the frame to the other is needed for hanging. A minimum print size of 8"x10" framed to 11"x14" is requested for visibility. The maximum framed size allowed is 24"x36".

Each club member may submit up to two photographs.

The title of the photograph, the artist's name and contact information: telephone number and/or email address should be attached. The artist may also include a website address, if applicable. This information should be transmitted to exhibits@planophotographyclub.com by Monday, August 10 so an Excel spreadsheet of submissions and ID cards for the wall next to the pictures can be prepared.

Subject matter is not restricted except that portraits of people are excluded and also anything that might be considered controversial. The showcase entries will be judged and First, Second and Third Place ribbons will be awarded as well as Honorable Mention. For fairness in judging, do not place your name on the front of your submission.

Details regarding when and where to submit your photographs will be forthcoming shortly as well as information about a reception to be held at the Municipal Center.
