In the interest of credibility, photographs that misrepresent the truth, such as manipulation to alter the subject matter, or situations which are set up for the purpose of photography, are unacceptable in Photojournalism competition. No elements may be moved, cloned, added, deleted, rearranged or combined. No manipulation or modification is permitted except resizing, sharpening, cropping, selective lightening or darkening, and restoration of original color of the scene. No special effect filters can be applied. Any adjustments must appear natural.



(continued from Page 1) farmstead and museum entry fee, the paid professional talent and some simple refreshments and snack items provided throughout the 5-hour event.

The goal of this event is to provide an opportunity for club members to (#1) experience working with professional talent, and (#2) to continue learning, through on-location experience,

how to shoot only with available outdoor light.

The venue is one of the very few how to pre-pay for the event or historic locations in Plano. The farmstead, built in 1891, was a working farm in the very early days of Plano. Many preserved artifacts there can be used as backgrounds for your photography. You can learn more about this venue prior to the photo shoot by going to its website at www.HeritageFarmstead.org.

PPC ex-president: Study, travel with the greats

Editor's Note: This is another in a series designed to introduce PPC members to one another. Interviewer is Bill J Boyd. Featured member is John Lehman.

I have lived in Texas almost 25 years, moving here from a small town in Central Illinois. I was president of the camera club in my hometown before moving here. My wife, Lois, and I were co-presidents of PPC several years ago. I am a psychologist by profession. My primary practice focuses on law enforcement agencies. We have one

daughter and two grandchildren who live in the Metroplex.

I have been a member of PPC for about 15 years. I have been in the Master's Class for several years,

working my way up from the beginner's class when I joined. I am not active in any other local photo clubs. I am active on the web on <u>Photosig.com</u>, a critiquing web site, and have a page on <u>flickr.com</u> which has had over 160,000 image views (<u>www.flickr.com/</u> windsweptphoto/).

I got my first camera (a Kodak Brownie) when I was in 3rd grade. I have always been interested in photographing people and started shooting pictures of the neighborhood children back then. I have been an active photographer most of my life. My first SLR was a used Pentax Spotmatic, I graduated up to a Contax and then into Canon SLR's with an Elan II and have been a Canon shooter ever since. I shoot with a Canon 40D. I have a variety of Canon lenses including a 28-135 IS, 17-40 L, 70-300 IS, and a 50mm 1.8. I have two strobes, a 550EX and a new 430EX, with a Canon wireless infrared flash controller. Since I shoot mostly in the studio, I use the 28-135 the most. Lois and I have a complete studio at home including three Photogenic 1250's and assorted light modifiers. I usually carry a Canon G9 when I don't have my larger camera equipment with me.

> My primary interest is photographing people. I also enjoy photographing old buildings, historical reenactments and the involvement of people in the landscape. Landscape photography and nature photography are things I enjoy seeing but

are not particularly interesting to me for shooting. My favorite subject is artistic nudes shot in the studio. I usually arrange a studio shoot of some type once or twice a month. I then spend a lot of time in postproduction creating a variety of images (many black and white) from the images I have shot.

Lois and I have done two photo trips this year—Hawaii and New Mexico. Most of the rest of the year will be spent here.

My 28-135 IS is my most used lens. It is a good choice for the studio and for general purpose photography. My 17-40 L lens is also a nice studio lens. I love Adobe Lightroom, especially with the new version 2 improvements. I use Nik Color Efex and Silver Efex filters a lot. They are now Lightroom compatible, so I don't



move images to Photoshop very often any more. I can process most things in Lightroom.

Lois and I have had the pleasure to travel and study with some great photographers—Joe McNally, Bob Krist, Eddie Adams and others. Those have been great highlights. The publication of my portrait of Frank McCourt, the Pulitzer prize winning author of *Angela's Ashes*, in Popular Photography was a highlight for me. The image was taken on a photo trip in Ireland on which Joe McNally and Frank McCourt were our leaders.

There is a lot to be learned by studying and traveling with great photographers. I highly recommend the Santa Fe Photography Workshops and the Popular Photography Photo Treks because they give you extended time with these people to get a real feeling for how they work. It also allows you to spend one on one time with them. I really treasured the Ireland trip because Lois and I had breakfast almost every morning with Joe McNally (we were the only early risers in the group). This was fairly close after 9/11 and he had published his popular book of portraits of the 9/11 workers shortly before the trip. Recently he has published two very popular books, The Moment It Clicks and Hot Shoe Diaries (both of which I highly recommend).



Photography course recommended to sharpen skills

I have lived in Texas almost all of my life. Most of that time has been in the Metroplex.

I have been a member of the PPC for about 10 years. Recently I joined the Complete Photographer and plan to go to my first meeting in September.

What do you like to shoot, how often do you shoot, etc.

I am interested in shooting landscapes, still life, flowers, abstracts, family vacations, my family, etc. Currently I am enrolled in a Color Photography course at Collin College, so I shoot every week. Describe any photo shoots and/ or photo trips you want to do in the next few months.

I am interested in just about any photo shoots/trips that the PPC organizes. I have enjoyed going on shoots and



getting to know members as well as learning tips from other photographers.

What lens to you use most often?

For Christmas I got a Canon EF 16-35mm, so I have been using it quite a bit lately.

What software do you use for post-processing your images.

I use Photoshop PS3. I bought

Lightroom, but I haven't used it much since it keeps crashing on me. Hopefully someone in the club can clue me into how to resolve this problem.

Any photography advice for our club members?

I would recommend taking a photography course to sharpen one's skills and learn how to make better photos. I would also suggest club members get involved in the photo shoots/trips and to volunteer. You meet the nicest people and learn from one another.

Tell us about some of your nonphotography interests.

My time is taken with piano lessons, Bible study, volunteering at the Collin County Child Advocacy Center, reading, exercising, etc. My life is full and blessed.
