


#### BEST OF SHOW: BEKA AND JASON BY JOHN LEHMAN

This image was shot at the PPC Spring Model Shoot. The lighting was my standard set-up as shown at the workshops we've done—a very large (5' diameter) soft box camera left at 45 degrees and fairly high as the main light, a fill soft box to camera right and a hair light behind. Very little Photoshop post-production, this is pretty much right out of the camera with just some cropping. Camera: Canon 40D with a 28-135 IS Canon lens, which is my most used lens.

I have worked with Beka several times and knew Jason from last year's model shoot. Both are actors. I knew that Beka really lit up on a set when you asked her to act out emotions, characters, etc. She's very animated when you give her an acting assignment. We told them to act out being a couple going through various emotions and they delivered a lot of really interesting images. This was one of my favorites.

As I have worked to help members at the model shoots, the most important thing that would improve their images is to talk to the models and get them involved in the process of creating the images. Watch their natural ways to stand, sit, etc. and give them things to do or emotions and ideas to act out or imagine.

This image is another example of the fact that contest winning images can be shot at club events, so come and join us when we get together to shoot!

### JULY GUEST SPEAKER: PAHO MANN: AN ARTIST VIEW OF THE CONTEXT OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Paho Mann's work investigates the physical manifestation of individuality, using both traditional photographic practices and contemporary digital technology. His work has been included in exhibitions at the Walker Art Center, (Minneapolis, MN), Carnegie Museum of Art (Pittsburgh, PA), Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art (Overland Park, KS), Arizona State University Art Museum (Tempe, AZ), and the Tucson Museum of Art (Tucson, AZ), among others. Mann's work is included in the permanent collection at Tucson Museum of Art and the Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art. Mann has been commissioned for public art projects by the city of Phoenix.

Mann was born in 1978 on his parents homestead near Snowflake Arizona. In 1992 he moved with his family to Albuquerque, New Mexico where in 2001 he received a BFA from the University of New Mexico. He received his MFA from Arizona State University in 2007. Currently, Mann lives and works in Denton, Texas, where he teaches photography at the University of North Texas.

September 25 – Dallas Zoo

October – Fall Outdoor Model Shoot. Several locations are being considered including Arbor Hills Nature Preserve in west Plano, or Old City Park in Dallas. The primary date is Saturday, October 2nd; with Saturday, October 9th as a make-up date in case of bad weather on October 2nd. October 16th is a slight possibility if the venue we choose is booked October 2nd and 9th. The event will be held on one of those three Saturdays in October. We will be using professional models and will require signup and payment of a fee.

October – Showcase 2010 Exhibit: PPC will be exhibiting framed photographic images at the Plano Convention Center during October and November. Bring your framed and wired work to the September PPC meeting or contact Jamie Hilbig (972) 423-0793 or Ed Auger (972) 964-3383 to make special arrangements to secure your art no later than Sept. 28th. A second exhibit is pending at the Courtyard Theatre in Plano. This would allow us to collect two pieces of art from each photographer at the Sept. 27th PPC meeting for display at these two separate locations. More details will follow regarding the labeling of your art. The framed size should not exceed 24 x 36 inches.

November 2<sup>nd</sup> – Fort Worth Botanical Gardens and the Amon Carter Museum to view the Ansel Adams exhibit.
