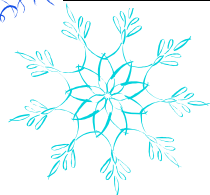
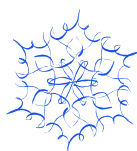
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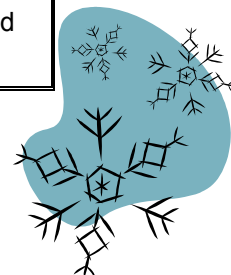
## BEST OF SHOW: *MARCH EVENING* - BY MAREA DOWNEY

Fascinated by the view from the bedroom window where I was staying in a small fishing village in Cornwall, I wanted my photograph to say something about this cottage, which has stood for centuries so close to the sea. You may notice the chains that hold down the thatched roof during winter storms. "March Evening" is the result of 1) persistence in setting up the shot day after day (wondering if the owners of the cottage would turn their lights on); 2) patience, waiting by the tripod as darkness fell, and 3) a measure of luck with the weather. A few months earlier, David Noton, a famous English photographer, had taught me more in 24 hours about how to make landscape images like this, than I had learned previously in my whole life.

It was around 7 p.m. I put my Canon 5D on a tripod at the bedroom window. I set the camera to 100 ISO, and held back the sky with a graduated ND filter, 0.9, and took this image at f.14 for 30 seconds, aperture priority, on a cable release, of course! I dialed in -0.67 exposure compensation. The picture has only limited post-production work done on it: Auto in the Levels menu in Photoshop, and a little dodging of the white walls of the cottage, where the ND filter had darkened them.

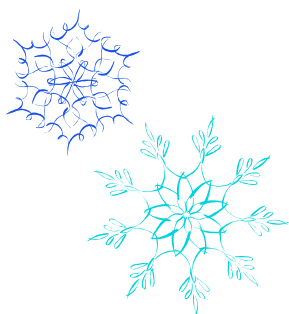
## OTHER ACTIVITIES OF INTEREST

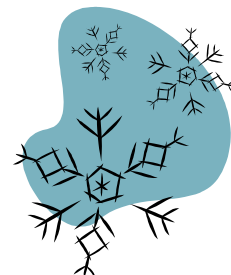

## Panoramic Print Competition Rules

The board has decided to update and clarify the rules concerning the Panoramic Print Competition in March, 2011. The rules state that the actual image must have an aspect ratio of at least 2 to 1 or greater and must be at least 96 square inches. The maximum size of the mat or mounting board (if un-matted) is 16 x 24.

This allows for a 7 x14 inch image to be easily printed on 11 x 14 inch paper or two panoramic images can be printed on 12 x 18, 16 x 20 or 20 x 30 inch paper, all of which are available at many local processors, such as Costco.

The image may be in horizontal or vertical format. The image may be stitched from multiple images or cropped from a larger image.

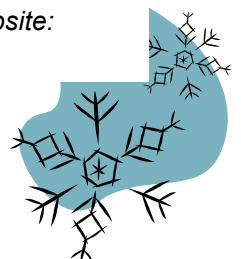

If you want to get started now and learn the ropes, we know we have openings in Membership, Secretary, and Field Trips. We would also like to have someone help in Contests starting now!

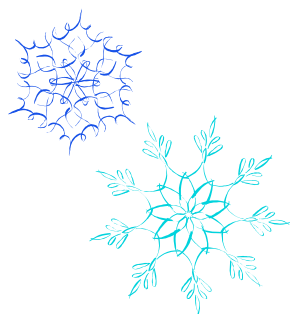
