

BEST OF SHOW: SHETLAND PONIES GRAZING AT DAWN - BY MAREA DOWNEY

Ever gone out with a shot pre-visualized only to find that the elements won't come together? I was on a beach in December to get the sun coming up over the sea, but the tide was in, the waves were crawling along, and clouds were a bit sparse. As I looked around I noticed that a couple of rocks on the nearby headland moved! Several Shetland ponies had been put to work, grazing the headland during the winter. A notice warned that Shetland ponies are curious, and that they do bite. Actually they were extremely interested in my camera bags and tripod, and slobbered all over them before I could persuade them to go back to work, so I could try to photograph them and the rising sun. Technical stuff: F9 at 1/125th, -.67 underexposed, at ISO 400, with a focal length of 28mm and of course a tripod and a grey grad filter 0.9 to hold back the sky. The frost on the ground was a freebie. Just one of those times when the shot was far from what I had visualized, but keeping an open mind for other subjects turned into a worthwhile photographic opportunity.




