BEST OF SHOW: STORM OVER BLUE MESA - BY DENNIS FRITSCHE

Blue Mesa Reservoir, Colorado's largest body of water, was formed by the Gunnison River which also created the Black Canyon of the Gunnison. I was going from Crested Butte to Ouray and was passing by it for my second or third time. But today was different – there were clouds! And not just clouds but storm clouds!


I used a tripod, panorama-head, an adjustment rail, Nikon D3X and 24-70mm zoom. Manual settings – f11, 1/250, 70mm, RAW. I shot three over-lapping images with the camera in the landscape orientation. (Should have shot six in the portrait orientation to get more sky, like the judge said). I ended up with a nice set of images.

I combined them using Photoshop CS5's panorama tool which I find quite good. I cropped some of the foreground out as it was not very exciting. I thought black and white was a good treatment (I might go back and work on the color presentation). I did a lot of fine tuning on the image to really emphasize the clouds and the detail in the cliffs. I used Nik Software Color Efex Pro Complete – Tonal Contrast and Darken/Lighten Center filters plus dodging and burning.

I printed this several times finding each to be a little flat and boring. I kept pushing the image to create the drama I saw that day. Since it was a stitched image from a high resolution camera, I had plenty of information in the file and it held up very well, I think.

I guess a lesson here is that seeing a locale or an object just once is usually not enough. Pictures taken the other times I passed here were OK record shots, but nothing special. It took the dramatic weather to make this dramatic image. By the way, this image won a Bronze Star in the Epson International 2011 Panorama Contest.

GUEST SPEAKER - AN EVENING WITH LEWIS KEMPER - SPONSORED BY CANNON

Lewis Kemper, a Canon Explorer of Light Photographer, has been photographing the natural beauty of North America and its parklands for over 30 years. His work has been exhibited and published in magazines, books, and calendars worldwide.

He received a BA in Fine Art Photography from the George Washington University in 1976. "The experience of working at The Ansel Adams Gallery was very influential in my development as a photographer", he states. He has been selected to Canon's Explorers of Light program featuring 62 of the country's most influential photographers.

Kemper's photographs are in many private collections as well as in the permanent collection of the Baltimore Museum of Art and Kaiser Permanente. His work has been shown nationally in galleries and museums. Some of these include: The Frederick S. Wight Gallery, The Baltimore Museum of Art, The Cornell Museum, The Princeton Gallery of Fine Art, The Popular Photography Gallery, The Ansel Adams Gallery, Photographer's Gallery and the Yosemite Valley Visitor Center.

He is the author of "The Yosemite Photographer's Handbook". and "The Yellowstone Photographer's Handbook." He was the photographer for "Ancient Ancestors of the Southwest", published by Graphic Arts Center Publishing. His monograph, "Capturing the Light" won the People's Choice Awards in Fine Art in the 2009 Photography Book Now competition. His latest publication "Photographing Yosemite Digital Field Guide" was voted in the top 20 field guides. And he produces the acclaimed Photoshop training DVD's "The Photographer's Toolbox for Photoshop®". His work has been published in numerous books including publications by The Sierra Club, The National Geographic Society, Little and Brown, APA Insight Guides, Prentice Hall, and Hyperion Books.

His pictures have appeared in calendars published by Audubon, The Sierra Club, The Mono Lake Coalition, Self Realization Foundation, Golden Turtle Press, The Nature Conservancy, Tide-Mark Press and others. His work has appeared in magazines that include: Backpacker, Women's Sports and Fitness, The Walking Magazine, Sierra, Motorland, Terre Sauvage, Environmental Protection Magazine, National Wildlife, and others, including National Geographic Traveler.
