We were taking mostly candid photographs but after a couple of hours we sort of felt we had the subject covered. That was when we just split off and just started shooting what interested us. I happened to see this elephant through the trees and he was heading my way, so I waited and the wait paid off. After taking the shot with my Canon T2i with a Sigma 18-250 lens at f/10 1/80 sec, I did a little cropping and post processed it with Topaz Labs Adjust. I was totally surprised with the recognition.

#### GUEST SPEAKER - MAKING AN IMPACT WITH YOUR PHOTOGRAPHS - MAREA DOWNEY

Marea Downey, born in England, has lived in Texas for over thirty years. Marea formerly ran the Photographic Library, and worked in Management Training for Shell International in London. Currently, Marea contributes her time teaching photography to the Advanced Art students at Fairhill High School in Dallas, and her students have won numerous statewide honors. She has also given two photographic seminars at Midway College, Kentucky.

She is the author of two photographic essay books, and her work has been published in national magazines, books and newspapers. Her prints have been used for postcards, and bought by individuals. She has done assignments for websites, the 2011 Leukemia Research calendar, individual portraits, weddings, and a nationally published travel guide. Her photographic work has been selected to decorate the offices of several corporations and a residential community clubhouse.

Marea studied under National Geographic photographers Bob Krist, Joe McNally, and Steve McCurry; and English landscape photographers David Noton and Charlie Waite. Marea shares some of the tips she has learned from her favorite professionals, and provides insights into photographs that make an impact.



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: PONDERINGS

In May I returned from a fabulous road trip out to Yosemite. I have never been to most of the signature destinations and so I took the opportunity to stop at Painted Desert, Grand Canyon, Death Valley, Sequoia, Yosemite, Joshua Tree, Saguaro, and White Sands. WOW! I was just blown away with all I saw and I all I was able to photograph. This month I'll just ramble a bit since I have been pondering these subjects.

The first pondering is "the right time at the right place". Take the Tunnel View in Yosemite. This is a most famous spot and every photographer who has visited has shot this view. Ansel Adams shot it many times – some of his shots are mundane and some are just spectacular. The difference is usually the weather – was there just a snow fall? was there that clearing storm? I had four evenings to try to get something special and what I got was competent images that I like because I was there, but images that are not going to win any prizes. You can increase your likelihood of success by researching the area and the shot to know the best time of year and the best time of day. Also, you have to go back to your favorite spots many times until it all comes together – if it ever does.

The second pondering is "what am I going to bring to this image that is new?" This is really hard. Go to flikr.com and search on "tunnel view Yosemite". I stopped counting at 1500. Admittedly, most are not great photos, but there were a number of really good ones. They were shot at every time of day, every season, and every weather condition. So I am not going to be the first one to take that shot. If I submit my version to a competition, the judge will have seen all the variations and has probably taken many of them. My advice is to be very thoughtful about submitting your version of the classic shot; your version must be as good as the best to get a nod in competition. You are likely to see some of my Yosemite images in contests, but they will be the lesser known views or some more intimate memory from the trip.

I don't want to discourage anyone, but do think about those who have come before you and the very high bar that has been set. Do consider an image that is special for some other reason – it is likely to do a lot better in a club competition.
