



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BEST OF SHOW: CLASSIC CHEVROLET - BY SHARLOTT HASTY

The Plano Photography Club offers numerous activities which give members opportunities to capture images. Members were offered "photographer's passes" to the Leake Auto Auction held at the Dallas Market Hall. The building has a row of large windows around the top letting in natural light which mixes with bright light from rows of florescent bulbs. The highly polished and colored curved metal of the cars created interesting light patterns which changed with every shooting position. This image was captured using a hand held Nikon D300 and a Nikkor 18-200 lens with a focal length of 22 mm. In manual mode, the shutter speed was 1/40 second, aperture 6.3, ISO 800, adobe RGB color space and a white balance of cool-white fluorescent. Editing was done using Photoshop CS5. Thanks to Thinh Nguyenphu for making the arrangements for the club.

CHANGES TO JUDGING

We have some changes in the judging and commenting processes. Most of our judges come from PSA. PSA works hard to increase the skills of the judges to bring the member clubs the best learning experience possible. As clubs continue to increase in size and the number of contest entries also increase, commenting on all the entries is becoming more of a burden to the judges and some judges have stopped participating. PSA is making changes with many clubs and asked us to give it a try. Also, we must weigh the benefit of ever longer meetings as the comments continue to grow.

Beginning with the July meeting (June contest), the following will be the new process:

- 1. Judges will score all of the entries as usual.
- 2. They will comment on one entry from each submitter (or two if both entries receive an award). This will allow them to go into more depth.
- 3. We will experiment with real-time via phone judging in August







JOSE ARTILES - PHOTOGRAPHER OF THE YEAR

Jose was not only 2010-2011 Photographer of the Year, but also winner of Master Class, Digital Image, and Print Image of the year. A clean sweep. I asked Jose to tell us a little about himself. So here is his story. – The Editor.

My grandmother gave me a box camera for my 7th or 8th birthday, but I became really fascinated with photography after I discovered Life magazine in the early 50's. Years later, I moved to Miami from Cuba, rather abruptly, after the failure of the Bay of Pig invasion in 1961. I asked for, and was granted, political asylum mostly because of health concerns. You see, after that debacle it became very unhealthy for me to stay in Havana...

After living in Miami for a few months I moved to NYC and, because of my interest in photography, I applied for a job at Time Inc., publishers of Time, Life, Sport Illustrated, and many more publications. Much to my surprise, I was hired.

I also attended NYU trying to become a journalist but because of constant work schedule changes (actually, appalling lack of gray matter, but "schedule changes" sounds better) I never graduated. Any way, after 35 years of having fun in the photo lab, where I was supposed to be working as a photo lab technician, management finally got wise to me, but I beat them to the punch and retired in 1996. I then moved to Frisco where years prior we had built a house. My wife, Mary Ann, has been working for American Airlines practically since the Wright Brothers first decided to change jobs... Oh, wait, she is going to read this! NO, NO, NO, I didn't mean to imply she is old!! No, no. What I meant to say is that although she's been working for AA for a very long time, paradoxically, she is still a teenager! Ummm... Yes, that's exactly what I meant. Really!

At any rate, the point is that we built a house in Frisco and for years I used to fly every weekend from LGA to DFW and back. Retirement finally allowed me to stay put in Frisco on a permanent basis. Although, since the family is in NY, we still go back on a regular basis. I mention this as an explanation in case somebody may have noticed the frequent New York entries in the contests.

As to photography, which is what the club members may be really interested in, all I can say is that to me, photography is visual (WOW, what a momentous discovery!) therefore, images must have an impact. They must be compelling. They must demand attention. And part of that is achieved in the darkroom or computer. There has to be an interesting subject in front of the camera to begin with, obviously, but that image can not only be totally ruined by sloppy camera work, but also by unsatisfactory darkroom (now-a-days it's called "post processing") techniques. The reverse is also true. A mediocre image can be improved, sometimes even saved, by good "lab" or post processing work. By that I mean color correcting, dodging, burning in, balancing the exposure and, on occasions, cropping to achieve correct composition or to improve it. I also mean that, for the most part, there must be a clear center of interest. Although, in some instances, chaos and confusion may be the reason for taking the photo in the first place. One point, though, the more of these things are done when taking the photo, the better, but that is not always possible. It should be noted that shooting RAW files is usually best.

Those techniques are nothing more than old fashion wet darkroom work, and I do that with all my images, regardless of whether they may be straight photography or heavily fake "creations" (yep, that smoking fish is one of mine). By the way, I hate to use the word "manipulation" because photography has always been about manipulation. In any event, since I do photography to please myself, as long as I know I achieved what I was trying to do, I really don't care much about the "judges" opinions because, in many cases, that is all it is: opinion. One judge may hate the photo but another one may love it. For me the most useful function judges can serve is to help photographers improve their images by making them aware of some aspect or element they may have missed or over done. Which is something that happens to me quite frequently. But that's another story.


