Fall Outdoor Model Shoot

The annual Fall Outdoor Model Shoot will be held Saturday, October 15th at the Plano Heritage Farmstead & Museum. The Core Talent Agency and Dawn Rochelle Agency will provide the model talent. The fee for this event is \$30 paid in advance. Sign-up and pay at the September 26th meeting. If you are unable to attend the meeting, you can mail a check to Ken Guthrie, made payable to Plano Photography Club. Checks must be received by September 30th. Only club members can attend this event. Membership forms are available at the September meeting.

The fee will cover the usage fees for the farmstead and museum entry fee, the professional talent fees, and some simple refreshments and snack items provided throughout the 5-hour event. The goal of this event is to provide an opportunity for club members to (#1) experience working with professional talent, and (#2) to continue learning, through on-location experience, how to get great images using only available outdoor light and small strobes. We will have one light set in the Pole Barn that can be used from 10 AM until 1 PM.

The Heritage Farmstead & Museum is a National and State Historic Landmark and an accredited museum. The museum is one of only 800 accredited museums in the entire US and the only one in Collin County. The farmstead, built in 1891, was a working farm in the very early days of Plano. There are many artifacts that have been preserved and can be used as backgrounds for your photography. The One Room Schoolhouse is a reproduction and we should be able to gain access to that building. The landmark Victorian House however, will not be available to our club members. You can learn more about this venue prior to the photo shoot by going to their website located at <u>www.HeritageFarmstead.org</u> and read more of the history of this old farm.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: PRINTING AND DISPLAYING PHOTOS



The October competition is one of the two where the format is printed media. We also have several opportunities to display our printed works in public venues. You are encouraged to take advantage of these opportunities. With the prevalence of digital and on-line displays of photographs, why do we bother with printing? Here are a few reasons:

- See what your camera is capable of capturing. There is much more detail, color depth, and subtle shading than you are seeing on a low resolution screen image. - Develops your in-camera framing and composition skills, since you can't rely as much on cropping.

- Another level of creative options open up - Paper finish and mounting and matting presentation.

We will have a presentation at the September meeting discussing printing and display of your photography. You can also call on several of the Club members who love the look, the feel, and the richness of printed media.
