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#### BEST OF SHOW: STRENGTH PERSONIFIED - BY KAREN CHANEY

This image was taken on March 25th, 2011 at the Garland Events Center where they were hosting the Carden Circus International. I was enjoying taking pictures of many events at the circus when I noticed a fantastic shadow on the corrugated metal wall of the event center. Remembering that there was a shadow/silhouette competition coming up soon in our photo club - I took multiple shots of the aerialist's shadow. My camera is a Canon Rebel XT and the lens I had on that night was a 70 – 300mm Quantaray. I was set to auto focus, aperture priority mode with aperture set at 5.6. Based on critique feedback from the anonymous master judges I changed the image to black and white and bumped up the contrast in Photoshop Elements. (Thanks for the tip Master Photographer!)

I am left scratching my head in confusion on winning Best Of Show with this picture. I loved many of the other photos that were entered in this contest much more than mine (i.e. "The 1st George W" by Danette Volkmer was my personal favorite). Even though I took this picture with the intent of entering it in the shadow/silhouette contest, I'm glad I waited until the open category. As has been said in the photo club multiple times, judges have different and personal preferences. I am very glad, and jaw dropping-ly surprised, that the judge chose my photograph.

I was asked to tell something about myself so I've chosen to tell about my "job". I entered a photo contest that my local newspaper (The Murphy Messenger) was holding in the fall of 2010. The publisher/owner enjoyed the photos I submitted and offered me a job as staff photographer which turned into a reporter/photographer position. I have been "working" since January and have enjoyed having the thrill of seeing my photos in print twice a month. I use quotation marks around job and working because this position is more fun than anything I could have hoped for.

#### Guest Speaker — Light and Focus - Featuring Images from recent trips to Japan AND ALASKA - DAN LEFFEL

Dan will discuss two of the most important aspects of photography, responding to what the light is presenting you and making sure the parts of the images you want to be in focus are in focus. The presentation will be 50% instructional tutorial and 50% slide show featuring the snow monkeys and other wildlife of Japan, and the grizzly bears of Katmai National Park and other scenic images of Alaska. Compositional elements that create images with impact will be discussed during the slide show.

Dan has been an avid photographer for over 45 years, and has been pursuing photography full time since he retired 12 years ago from EDS. His passion for photography includes shooting fine art, scenic landscapes and wildlife, as well as commissioned portraits and model portfolios in his studio.

Dan's photography has taken him on two 12 day rafting trips through the Grand Canyon, an 11 day rafting trip through the Alaskan wilderness, and on trips spanning North America to Antarctica. He has hiked the Inca Trail to Machu Picchu in Peru and photographed Iceland. This past February Dan spent two weeks in Japan photographing the snow monkeys and other wildlife, and this summer he spent two months photographing in Alaska. He frequently photographs New England, the Colorado Plateau, the Four Corners area, all parts of California, the Canadian Rockies, and the Northwest.

Dan has earned first place awards in the Dallas Sierra Club photography contest and the Heard photography contest, as well as at many Plano Photography club competitions. He has also received numerous acceptances in the annual juried Showcase competition, sponsored by the North America Nature Photography Association (NANPA). He is a frequent presenter to local camera clubs and organizations in the DFW area. Dan's photography is marketed globally by the ageFotoStock company, based in Spain. Before "retiring" from club competitions he won "Photographer of the Year" honors with the Plano Photography Club for the last three years he competed.









#### REPORT ON PSA CONFERENCE, SEPTEMBER 2011

The 73rd Annual International meeting of the Photographic Society of America was held in Colorado Springs. This was a wonderful setting with near perfect weather. People came from as far away as Australia and China just to attend the conference.

There was a wide variety of activities available to the attendees, including photo excursions to the Garden of the Gods, Pikes Peak and the Chevenne Mountain Zoo. Classes were offered in Elements, Photoshop. Lightrooom, Photodex Proshow Gold, and HDR Efex pro from Nik Software.

Among the featured presenters, elegant Tyler Stableford captured the audience with his dramatic photos of mountaineering and skiing. He emphasized that photographs should tell a story. George Lepp and Joe Le Fevre inspired us with photos of nature. They both stressed the importance of taking good photos in our own back yard, even if Texas is not as spectacular as Colorado. Eleanore Avery gave a program entitled "Bhutan, Kingdom in the Clouds". Jodi Cobb, National Geographic photographer, spoke of the loneliness of her assignments in China in the 70's. Energetic and knowledgeable, Julianne Kost from Adobe, conducted classes in Light room and Masking and Compositing in CS5. Her website www.jkost.com is searchable and has many training videos in Lightroom and Photoshop.

There were so many presentations it was difficult to decide which to attend. Some of the choices were: Macro, HDR, Monochrome, Conversion, Infrared, Raw Power, Sports Photography, Printing for competitions, and ten favorite Photoshop tips.

Next year's PSA will be held in the lovely city of San Francisco.

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: IMAGE ANALYSIS: IS IT OBJECTIVE OR SUBJECTIVE?

PSA offers training for judges and one of the exercises is to analyze a set of images. For exactly the same image, here is a sampling of the comments "The image is over exposed; The image is underexposed; The depth of field is off; The depth of field is right on; The center of interest is placed well; The center of interest is off, use the rule of thirds; The black and white is a good choice; I think it should be in color.; The highlights are blown out; The highlight has good detail; The shadows are too dark, need detail; The shadows are good and balance the image well; The leading line should not come from the corner; The composition is excellent; The image should be flipped; The diagonal lines are just right from right to left." And the winner is: "I didn't know what it was so I can't judge it.""

Since judging is both subjective (opinions) and objective (facts), comments will naturally be all over the place. You can't control what the judge will think and how he will react to the SUBJECTIVE nature of the photographic art, but there are things you can do to make sure you maximize the impact of your image from the OBJECTIVE point of view. Here is a checklist to consider. Of course you must determine how it applies to your artistic purpose in each photograph.

Horizon and buildings straight; Something in focus; A point of interest; No clutter; No dust spots; No blown highlights; Some shadow detail; Corrected colors; No processing artifacts; Not oversharpened. Following these will not guarantee a 15 on every image, but should raise your score a point or two.
