BEST IN SHOW: A BETTER FUTURE - BY DENNIS FRITSCHE


I am honored that this black and white print won Best in Show. I think the judge switched 1st and 2nd several times before it landed on me – Jose's image of the church was also deserving. I'll start with a couple of comments about the judge's comments.

"The tonalities are very strong" This is because of the processing and the paper/printer. When working on the image, I went through several iterations of global contrast and brightness for the mid tones and end points and then a great deal of local dodging and burning to accentuate the blacks and lights. I printed it and still thought it had more to give, so more global and local adjustments until I was happy. I printed this on Canson Pantene Rag paper on an Epson 4880 printer. The paper and printer combination renders very deep blacks which gives it punch.

"The maker must have waited a long time to get these clouds and weather conditions just right" About two years. Part of the picture was taken in the Pan Handle in 2009 and the rest in Death Valley in 2011. The building was an old feed store with part of the roof missing. The road and clouds were from Death Valley following a rain shower which made the pavement dark with the lighter tire tracks. I was thinking about a composite and decided on these two. I brought them into Photoshop as two layers. After positioning the rain storm/road image, I used the layer mask and brush to allow me revel it at the end of the building (which was actually a solid wall). I accentuated the road way and tracks by dodging and burning.

"A Better Future" means the viewer/wanderer is leaving the decay and sordid building for a bright future, (Queue the music.)

Guest Speaker – *Nature Photography the GSCCC Way* – Larry Petterborg

The May program will be presented by a long time member of the Plano Photography Club, Larry Petterborg. Larry is a faculty member of the Texas Woman's University School of Physical Therapy where he teaches human anatomy. He joined the PPC prior to moving his family to Dallas from Columbia, Missouri in 1999. Originally from Utah, Larry was in graduate school in San Antonio when he joined his first camera club in the late 70's. He has been actively involved in organized photography ever since.

In addition to the PPC, Larry is a member of the Heard Nature Photography Club (HNPC), where he serves as the club's Gulf States Camera Club Council (GSCCC) representative. Local Camera clubs such as PPC and HNPC, as a condition of participating in monthly club competitions, must periodically forego competing and judge a contest. Last September, the HNPC judged the bimonthly GSCCC Nature contest. The May program will be a short overview of nature photography according to the rules of GSCCC nature photography competition and then a show of the images submitted from the various GSCCC member clubs, culminating in the choosing of an overall winner of the competition.

One of the last in the PPC to give up film and move to digital photography, Larry has come to fully embrace the joys of digital capture and processing. He is one of the very few people that utilizes Olympus equipment.







COMPETITION ASSIGNMENTS FOR 2012 - 2012 CONTEST YEAR

As was announced last month, the monthly competition has expanded from three to four classes or levels for a fairer balance of skills and awards. After promotions between classes, the previous middle level was separated into two levels: Intermediate and Advanced. Level assignments were based on frequency of participation, judge's points and place awards. Current competing members were notified of their assignment by May 15. Members who want to participate in the monthly competitions may elect to compete at the Beginner or Intermediate level their first year.

The board also announced the promotion of Marea Downey and Ronald Hasty to the Masters Class. Congratulations!

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

You've probably heard and used this saying more times than you can count, but have you applied it to your photography? Just like sports, music, or dance, you must practice "taking pictures" to achieve excellent photos. Even pros shoot thousands of pictures to capture one amazing image.

However, it is perfect practice that makes perfect; practicing mistakes only leads to frustration. The monthly club competitions are a great way to help you improve your practice. There are 6 themes each contest year to help you focus on developing a vision rather than indiscriminate shooting. Participating in the competitions forces regular practice of the craft, leading to new discoveries. Judges' comments give direction to your practice, and competing to place encourages perfect practice.

All club members may compete by registering on the competition web site: plano.photoclubservices.com. First-time participants may choose to compete at either the Beginner or Intermediate level. Even if you do not participate, you can improve your practice by observing other's entries and hearing the judge's comments, which are presented each month at the club meeting. Here's to perfect practice!

You may also bring a short slide show of no more than 3 minutes to share with members. CD or flash drive only.










