

Whether you print your own images or send them out, there are a few things you need to do to make sure the final print looks like the image on the screen. This Snapshot will cover sizing your image for printing, soft proofing your image, sending the file to be printed, and mounting and matting your image.

Guest Speaker – Travel Photography – Peter Poulides

 \mathcal{P} eter Poulides started his photographic life in Athens, Greece while attending high school. He really wanted

to be a travel photographer and, after a pilgrimage to NYC to show his portfolio in his 20's, landed his first national assignment with Travel & Leisure magazine. That began a long relationship with that publication including more than a dozen feature articles and several magazine covers. His travel work also included Travel Holiday, Food & Wine, Smithsonian Magazine, American Way and several other inflight publications. Early in his career he was named one of the top 100 travel photographers in the world by the editors at Travel & Leisure.

He believes that beyond being able to share your experiences with friends and family, travel photography gives you the ability to record your unique view of the world. The goal is not to come back with postcard perfect images of all the sites you visit. That's what postcards are for! He encourages photographers to shoot what they really see, what draws their attention, what seems exotic and interesting. Maybe it's people, or food, or traffic signs, architecture, gardens, water or crowds. Travel is a personal experience and your photography should reflect your personality.

At this meeting he will talk about his travel work and his ongoing archiving project to cull through about 220,000 color slides and scan them so he can put together a pair of books of his early work.


