BEST IN SHOW: WORM HOLE - BY DON CHAMPLIN

m T}$ his water drop shot was made using the Cognysis Stop Shot which allows


precise control of the size and timing of water drops. This is a two drop collision. When the first drop lands in the water it splashes up and then another drop is timed to collide; one splashing up and the other falling and colliding on that drop. It takes a while to get the timing down. The action is stopped by using short duration flash (1/13,500 sec). I used one flash unit placed underneath a white translucent Plexiglas container; the flash was covered with orange gel to give the color. Another flash was directly overhead fitted with a 24 x 24 softbox.

 ${\mathfrak O}$ n both sides I placed black foamboard to give the clear liquid some dark

edges and help define the drops. What took the most time setting up was getting the background not to have a sharp horizon line, I used a 1/8" white translucent Plexiglas sheet curved upwards rising out of the water, backlit with another flash. Camera is mounted on a stand and the shutter is synched with the Stop shot to capture the image when the collision occurs. This takes a little patience. Eventually some good collisions are captured. This was done using a Canon 180mm macro lens at f14 which is still not very much depth of field at 3 feet, less than an inch. Since this collision was off center the mushroom shape it created leans over towards the viewer. One can see into the column of water rising up and almost all is within the depth of field giving good overall sharpness.

The Gulf Coast Camera Club Council will hold its annual regional conference April 24-27 in Baton Rouge at the Crowne Plaza hotel, hosted by the Louisiana Photographic Society. All photo enthusiasts are invited to attend. Club membership is not required.

"This will be an opportunity to meet and learn with photographers from across the region," said LPS president David Arbour. GSCCC member states include New Mexico, Texas, Oklahoma, Mississippi and Louisiana. "Our meeting also celebrates the 60th anniversary of GSCCC, which formed in Baton Rouge in 1954," Arbour noted.
