

BEST IN SHOW: ~ METAPHOR - BY IRWIN LIGHTSTONE

This image is a bit unique, in that it was one of the very few that I did not seek to limit noise. Like grain in film, I thought noise would add a bit of grit and sharpness to this image. ISO was set for 2500, the fstop was f22, and the shutter speed was 1/125th of a second for hand holding. Knowing the traditional boundaries of earth/sky and sea/land were obscured by fog, I sought to create a more ethereal image....the huge fog bank enshrouded Haystack Rock and its reflection balanced against the tiny but more concentrated form of a lone person.

It was processed primarily in Lightroom and converted to black and white in Nik Silver Effects Pro.

She has also won many outside awards, including 2012 State Fair of Texas Best of Show in the Adult B&W category, as well as placing in all but one of the years shee entered; 2005 Dallas Zoo Grand Prize in the Feather, Fur & Scales contest, as well as several First Place awards; placing eight times in the Gulf States Camera Club Council End of Year competitions; and having two images published in Black & White

For twelve years mastering the art of photography has been a personal quest for Kaye Hargis. It has been a personal journey of creative expression, which has had its mountains and valleys. As enthusiasm is a key ingredient to success, she will explore ways to keep photography fun and engaging through self-directed projects and by learning new digital darkroom skills. 


