Best in Show: ~ Cool Jalapeno - By Don Champlin

I enjoy photographing liquids with High Speed Flash. The ability to capture moments that happen so fast that they can not be seen with the eye fascinates me, so this project was quite fun to do.

I started by setting up a large white diffusion panel in front of a tripod mounted camera and suspending the Jalapeno with fishing line between the two. This was lit with 3 flashes, one behind the diffusion panel gelled green and the other two front right and left fitted with strip boxes. After adjusting lights and getting the exposure and ratios where I liked the lights were covered in thin clear painters' plastic to protect them from splashing water. A 5' diameter inflatable children's swimming pool was paced under the target Jalapeno in order to collect the splashing water and keep it from flooding my garage.

One hand triggered the camera with a 5' cable release and the other hand was used to throw water onto the Jalapeno with a small bowl. I would scoop the water from a 5 gallon bucket and then with the bowl throw the water while triggering the camera and flash hoping to time it all correctly capturing something cool. 278 images were taken over 3 days starting with the initial testing using a water bottle and then advancing through a Jalapeno, Apple and Banana using various colors for backgrounds. Many misses were recorded but with persistence and patience the final result was successful. The selected image was then post processed in Lightroom and Photoshop tweaking contrast, color, clarity, sharpness and removing the fishing line and unattractive out of focus water drops.

Club members had a wonderful trip to the the Buffalo River National Park in northwest Arkansas, October 31st through November 3rd, during the fall color change. It is a big rock that juts out from the mountain large enough to hold many people. There was a group actually camping on the crag with a campfire!

which is a 220 foot tall rock bluff with the Buffalo River at it's base. The river was shallow allowing us to get down to the river floor. This was a good opportunity for us to shoot the rocks and reflection pictures. Another short hike took us along the scenic walk through Lost Valley where at the end in a cave is one of the tallest water falls in Arkansas. Several members challenged themselves by crawling through the cave. Other places stopped at by members were King's River Falls and Round Top Mountain Trail.

Plano Centre Exhibition






