Best in Show: ~ Spotlight Portrait - By Don Champlin


picture in The New Yorker Magazine of Al Pacino. It was a dramatic black and white portrait, I liked immediately and told him "we can do this". We made arrangements for a shoot in my garage studio the next weekend. I set up one light with an 8" reflector high and to the right with John sitting on a small stool and the camera on a stand. When I can I like the camera fixed so I can move around and change the setup and direct and keep the camera focused and the subject in frame. We shot for about 30 minutes making 84 frames each with a little different tweaked light angle, hand position, head tilt, camera height, distance and exposure until I was satisfied I had a good image to work with. I used a Canon 1DX mounted with the 70-200 II which is a fine portrait lens, this image was at 120mm.

One image was first loaded into Lightroom for initial processing of contrast, sharpness and saturation. Then it was off to OnOne Perfect B&W for conversion to black & white using the Hollywood Bogart Neutral preset. It was then moved into Photoshop for some spot removal, local sharpening, burning and dodging, the eye area received considerable work and a button was removed from the shirt, lint cleaned up and a logo removed. Back to Lightroom. Two virtual copies were made, one with added 2 stops and one with minus 2 stops exposure. These were then combined with Photmatrix into an HDR image using pictorial settings just to increase the overall tonal range, nothing exotic or wild which can be done when making large adjustments, which create ghosts and "pixel loco behavior". Then it went back into Lightroom for some polishing touches and preparation to print.

Fused WHCC for printing and have them mount it on foam board for me, using their online service which is very convenient. A 3 day turn around with them and the print was taken to Art & Frame Expo for matting. He does outstanding work.

election of an image for a print competition is much more challenging than a digital presentation. Focus, DOF, tones and saturation must all come together along with of course a good composition. Very little room for error in a successful print.

Guest Speaker – Dallas Down Low – Diana Souza

When art and awareness are the centrifugal force of attention – and a camera is bearing witness – expect enchantment and oddities to arise in equal proportion. Diana Souza offers us a glimpse of an artist's life seen from behind the camera lens. Her repertoire as a visual communicator has revolved around a lifelong career in graphic design and illustration – using a camera as one of her primary creative tools to communicate, elucidate and illuminate both public and private perspectives.

Currently, she is an adjunct instructor at the Art Institute of Dallas, where she teaches design and photography with a special emphasis on non-profit branding and mass market publishing. She has worked as a leader and innovator on creative teams in New York, New Orleans and Dallas, and holds a BFA in Communications Arts from the University of North Texas and an MFA in Arts and Technology from the University of Texas.

Dallas is a city where developers rule and wealth leads a parade of bulldozers to sanitize the old with the new. Quirkiness, the patina of character and the aesthetic of decay are sacrificed in this stampede towards progress, and history gets erased in the homogenized invasion of modernity. Paradoxically, Dallas is a city that loves art, so its taste for glitz and glamour and its lack of appreciation for the inherent artfulness of everyday life seems oddly out of sync. Dallas Down Low is a collection of images that celebrate the creativity that spills outside the lines of Dallas' high profile facade. Visual artist and Dallas native Diana Souza offers evidence that the elements of design and the principles of formal composition can be found not just in high places, but in low ones too. Dallas Down Low testifies that stories of unexpected lyricism hide in the most humble places – even in Dallas.


