#### Best in Show: ~ Taking A Hike- By Sharlott Hasty

We had only a short time at the Grand Prismatic Spring. Our target was White Dome Geyser and the Milky Way after dark. It was 6:00 PM, and the boardwalk was full of people. Since I was the one carrying a tripod, several people had stopped and asked me to use their cell phones to take a pictures of them. I thought, "this is taking my time and the sun is in the wrong spot." As I was preparing to quickly move on, I saw the silhouette of the walkers on the intersecting boardwalk with the steam rising around them. Perfect timing.

The image was taken with a D7100 100mm at 1/125 sec, f18, ISO 400. I converted the image to black and white and used basic editing in Lightroom 5, finishing up in Photoshop CC 2104.

### Guest Speaker - Coastal Grizzlies of Katmai National Park -Tom Savage

Tom has been involved with photography in one form or another since 7th grade when his uncle gave him a cheap Japanese copy of a Roleiflex camera, and he spent the next summer at a friend's ranch in southern California photographing movie companies filming western TV series like Wild Bill Hickok, the Cisco Kid, and Annie Oakley.

Owever, he didn't really get serious with photography as a hobby until 1983 when he joined the Lockheed Martin (then General Dynamics) Recreation Association Camera Club. He is also a member of the Fort Worth Camera Club and the Photographic Society of America (PSA).

With his favorite photography subjects being nature and photojournalism, he has won 24 Best of Show medals and 84 other medals since 2004 in 11 different countries. He has had three images published in Cowboys & Indians Magazine. In 2006, one of his images was "Most Honored" in Nature's Best Photography Magazine and displayed in the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History in Washington, D.C. during most of 2007. In that same year, he won the Grand Prize in Robin Pope Safari's photography contest and was awarded a free safari in Zambia. In 2008, one of his images was the PSA's Nature Image of the Year. In 2009 he placed 2nd in PSA's Photojournalism Projected Images in North America Who's Who listing.

Fresently he keeps busy with four volunteer jobs: the PSA Exhibition Standards Committee Chairman; the PSA Exhibition Standards Director for Nature; the Chairman for the PSA Nature Division; and the Gulf States Camera Club Council's Vice President for Competitions. In August of 2005, 2006, 2008, and 2013, Tom joined a small group of photographers and nature lovers on the coast of Katmai National Park to see and photograph grizzly bears. They employed retired tug boats owned and operated by Katmai Coastal Bear Tours. Each day they went ashore in a small skiff to photograph the resident bears, spending most of the time in Hallo Bay, as well as several other bays.

Gears of all ages from spring cubs (born the previous spring in hibernation) to old, scared males were abundant on the coast. One day, 19 bears were in sight. Tom photographed cubs playing with each other and with their mothers, cubs nursing, bears of all ages fishing for salmon, bears grazing in the sedges, and several bear "disagreements" over fish. One year, he was able to photograph a spring cub defending a fish from a fox. In 2013, a sow with a spring cub lay down and nursed her cub within 8 feet of his group.

The most exciting photography was of bears chasing salmon in the shallow water of the rivers where they emptied into the bay. Some bears didn't chase salmon, but just stayed in one spot and caught them as they swam near. Since female bears stay in the area where they were born, most of the sows in Hallo Bay are related to each other, and consequently, tolerate each other around their cubs, and even let the cubs play together. However, no male is allowed close to the cubs, since some males kill cubs. Several times he was able to capture images of females chasing males away from cubs.

In addition to bears, Tom photographed eagles, gulls, ravens, puffins, wading birds, and foxes, as well as the beautiful scenery of the Katmai Coast.





#### President's Message: A Vintage Photography Book

Thave lately been browsing through "The Amateur Photographer's Handbook" by Aaron Sussman. It was first published in 1941. The copy I have was the 6th printing, from 1962. Since we are all thinking "Vintage" for the March contest, this book fits right in. A lot of material is quite out-of-date, of course. In one section, the author compares images from a cheap camera and an expensive camera. His "expensive" camera was selling for \$50! Assuming 4% inflation every year since 1941, that \$50 camera is a \$900 camera today. His "cheap" camera cost three dollars. And it's true that Kodak Brownie cameras in the 1940's were generally under five dollars.

On the other hand, many parts of the book are still applicable to digital photography. The rules of composition haven't changed, and the section on how to light people for portraits still works today. What I like best about this book is some of the quotes. I'll leave you with this one from the author's foreword: "People have often asked me how I happened to take up photography. The fact is, you don't 'take up'

photography. It takes you up. One day you're walking around grim and growling, like Herman Melville just before an escape to sea. Then, suddenly, you have a loaded camera in your hand and all is well."
