

#### Best in Show: A Quiet Place- By Marie Hanson

The Chapel is in Grand Teton National Park in Wyoming. It was built in 1925 to serve guests and workers at the dude ranches near Jackson, WY. Local ranchers provided the construction materials, funding, and labor to build it. Inside the small rustic log chapel, behind the alter, is a large window that frames a view of the Cathedral Group of peaks. It is on the National Register of Historic Places and is owned and operated by St. John's Episcopal Church in Jackson.

I first got interested in astrophotography at Mike Mezeul's workshop at Ft. Griffin, in which our club participated a couple of years ago. I enjoyed that and have wanted to learn more. Last month I participated in a nightscapes workshop in Grand Teton National Park.

Along with the workshop, I planned a camping trip to Yellowstone, and the combined experiences were awesome. The Chapel was one of many places we photographed. This image was taken at 11:00 PM at night at the end of what is called the "Blue Hour", which is in the first two hours after sunset before you get the darkest skies. The church was light painted with 9 lights: 5 small lanterns inside, spotlight on the cross, stationary main light on the left, and fill light on the right.


