

Best in Show: Mask and Pearls - By John Lehman

Mask and Pearls was an image created for two projects--Art Deco and The Nude

Obscura Project. I am fascinated with the vintage look of the 1920's and 1930's, so I have set about to create images in the same styles, but with a modern flare. Most of these images are being created with professional models, as is this one. The Nude Obscura Project is over 6 years long now and has over 35 models represented, many amateurs, none of whom are identifiable in the images.

If this case the image was shot in my home studio using one studio flash in a fairly

small softbox with an egg crate grid on it. It was placed above the model and slightly to camera left so it shoots down on her from above. The image was shot in color, then converted to B&W using Topaz B&W effects placed on a separate layer. I then back off the opacity of that B&W layer to bring back hints of the color to create a hand tinted look like one might fine in an early image.

Guest Speaker – The Developing Landscape – Elizabeth Mellott

At 19, she moved to New York City for a short time, studying photography and fashion design at the Fashion Institute of Technology, before moving back to Texas. She received a Master's of Fine Art in Photography from the University of North Texas. Months after completing a MFA, Elizabeth began a full-time teaching position at Collin College. She teaches darkroom photography, alternative photography, artist's bookbinding, landscape photography and history of photography.

As an artist, Elizabeth incorporates a mix of mediums, crossing boundaries seamlessly. The majority of her work is

alternative and sculptural, with an emphasis on photography. The concept and viewer's experience are paramount to her, allowing materials and structure to serve these mixed media objects. She has exhibited and spoken internationally and has artwork in collections including the Museum of Fine Arts in Houston, Harry Ransom Center and the Center for Creative Photography.

The year 1839 marked the announcement of photography to the world. One year later major exploration of the

American West began. The camera, as a valuable tool, merged seamlessly with this exploration. Here the tradition of American landscape photography began. As the land changed, the American concept of the land changed as well, deeply etching the evolution of opinions in sliver gelatin and color prints. This presentation will began examining the history of the American landscape photography and will end with contemporary approaches in landscape photography.

People Photo Shoot Training Session

All of us have probably been asked (begged, prodded, cajoled) to photograph family events, portraits, etc. This PPC workshop is designed to help you do that successfully. It replaces the model shoots done in the past. The attendance will be limited to 30 members so that we can successfully have enough time together.

The morning session (10-12) will focus on training and education. The afternoon session (1-3) will provide opportunities to shoot a variety of family oriented images, including sports/action (at least one parkour athlete will be available to photograph), youth portraits, pets and opportunities to photograph each other. You are welcome to bring members of your family, pets, etc. to the afternoon session for help in photographing them.

Agenda for the day:

Morning 10-12:

1. Setting up your camera to shoot people—basic camera handling, preferred settings for various types of people images, etc.--Lois Lehman

Posing individuals, couples and family groups--James Edward, professional photographer and member of our club.
Lighting for indoor and outdoor shots using natural light, your flash, and reflectors—John Lehman

Lunch and informal sharing together at the church 12-1

Afternoon 1-3:

 \cdot Shooting inside and outside the church, with options to go to the green belt near Schimelpfenig Library, weather permitting. Mentors will be available to help you with your shooting.

• Options for things to shoot: Action (parkour athlete), youth portraits (teen model will be present), pets (bring your own), each other and/or your children, or grandchildren.

What to bring: Bring your camera, flash, and any reflectors or light modifiers you'd like help with mastering. It will dramatically improve your images if you bring/purchase a way to detach your strobe from your camera. Some of the newer cameras have built in infrared and/or radio control of the system flashes, acquaint yourself with those controls prior to the workshop. If you don't have that, there are cords (3' to 10' or more) for most major camera brands that allow you to shoot automatically off camera. If you get one, you'll find it worth the money. President's Message: A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words



🚓 its heart, photography, like all art, is about communication. We are all familiar with the phrase, "A

picture is worth a thousand words." For successful communication, there have to be at least three elements. You provide two of those elements when you compose and create a photograph. There is a communicator (you), and communication (your photo). The third element, an audience, is often harder to come by. For many photographers, whose photographs never leave their memory card or PC, the only audience is immediate family members. Hanging prints on the wall of your home extends the audience to your visitors. Camera clubs like ours provide a slightly wider audience, as we share photos with each other in our slide shows and contests. For some, though, even that is not sufficient. Several club members regularly publish images to personal websites, photoblogs, or to photo sharing sites such as Flickr, ShutterFly, 500px, or others. Some have created Facebook pages dedicated to photography or publish to their regular Facebook

accounts. Even those of us who are not seeking to sell photographs find satisfaction in knowing that an image we created has been viewed and responded to by a large audience including not only family and friends but strangers from around the world.
