Best in Show: Precious Cargo - By James Edward

This image means a lot to me. I shot the couple's wedding a few years prior; they were one of my earliest wedding clients and gave me a chance to cover their special day. Happy with their wedding pictures, when they had a child, they asked me to capture their baby's pictures. The husband is a fire fighter and they wanted something special showing his profession. At the fire station, I looked around for a suitable background and felt the wall would be a perfect fit, depicting the rough sturdy nature of the profession, while not being too distracting and taking away from the focus of the child. One of the parents knitted the outfit, that was perfect for the shoot. We carefully placed the newborn on the father's arm and captured this moment.

I used a single speedlite triggered by Pocket Wizards accompanied with an umbrella to act as a diffuser. I wanted a nice clean directional light to illuminate the subject. In post, I knew I wanted to ad some effects that would help the image stand out. I added some punch and contrast to the wall to give it a grittier feel, I added a vignette to keep the focus on the subject. I softened the baby's skin every so slightly, to maintain a newborn's delicate nature, purity, and fragility.




