Tintype Photography Presentation

Ever see an old, dark picture about the size of two postage stamps with a stern looking person staring out at you? It was probably a tintype. Once one of the most popular ways to make a portrait, tintypes are an important step in the evolution of photography that led to our present day digital cameras and the ubiquitous "selfie".

Back in the tintype heyday, people didn't really scowl anymore than they do today, probably even less. To make one of the pictures it was necessary to be perfectly still for a long time (up to a minute or more); special clamps held the sitter's head while they stared straight ahead – no wonder they had a sour expression. And, that's only the beginning of the story.

Today there is renewed interest in the old photographic processes and a new appreciation of the pictures created. Artists all around the world are experimenting and producing some powerful images. Modern tintypes are usually larger than the older ones, but most retain the somber visage.

Anyone who would like to learn more about the process, see the work of a modern tintype master or just has an interest in photography and it's history is invited to attend a free lecture and PowerPoint show at the University of Texas at Dallas. Keliy Anderson-Staley, a Houston-based artist, will talk about her work with wet-plate collodion tintypes and ambrotypes and show some of the haunting images she has produced, discussing them and explaining how they were made.

The presentation will be on Tuesday, February 28, 2017, at 7:00pm in the Davidson Auditorium, Erik Jonsson Academic Center, on the UT Dallas campus. UT Dallas is located in Richardson, TX, at 800 West Campbell Road, 75080-3021. A campus map is available at the school website "<u>utdallas.edu</u>"; the auditorium is identified on the map as JSOM 1.1118. The event is free and open to the public.
