Changes To Competition Images

The Board has announced that beginning with the May 2017 competition, the maximum allowed image dimensions have been increased to 1920 x 1080 pixels. This allows images in what is known as "wide screen" or HD format. There is still a 10 MB file size limit. This also applies to images submitted for club activity shows.

Competition Changes

The Board has announced that beginning with the 2017-2018 club year, there will be no April competition. There will be an April, 2017 competition. The contest year will run from May through March and consist of 10 competitions instead of 11.

The annual awards dinner will coincide with the regular May, 2018 meeting instead of a separate awards dinner in June.

For 2017-2018 club year, There will be two special end of year awards:

Portrait Award
Photojournalism Award

Any member can submit up to three entries in each special award category. Digital submissions are due at the April, 2018 meeting. An overall winner in each category will receive the award and a plaque. The next two entries will receive second and third place rosette ribbons. The results of these special awards are not considered in the high points, image of the year, or photographer of the year competitions.

Members may propose and sponsor additional awards and provide the accompanying plaques and ribbons.

Light Painting Exercise

On February 11, 2017, about 20 eager Plano Photography Club members met to learn about Light Painting. We had two setups in a field, an old Jeep and a garden tractor. Each was positioned in front of some trees with a view of the sky in the background. It is important to have a good foreground subject, a middle-ground, such as trees, and a clear view of the sky as the background.

Much of this exercise involved using the camera in manual mode. So we all needed our camera manuals and a small flashlight to get all the settings correct.

Once we had our cameras set up, we practiced focusing in near total darkness. We used several extra-bright flashlights to highlight our foreground subjects so that the photographers could focus. Then everyone switched to manual focus. Whenever we recomposed our image, we had to refocus.

Next we made some exposures of the night sky. We used wide-angle lenses at their largest aperture and, setting our cameras on manual, set exposure for 30 seconds. We adjusted ISO to obtain a good exposure. For F 2.8, ISO 100 to 800 worked fine. However, each camera and lens is different, and the sky changes in darkness.

We also experimented with White Balance. Usually 3600 to 4200 gives the best results. The sky should look dark blue or black. A White Balance of Daylight gives the sky a muddy brown appearance. Even if you are shooting raw, setting White Balance correctly is important. You have to balance two different light sources, stars and the flashlight.

Different flashlights have different colored lights. LEDs are very blue, while incandescent are very red. It is important to be able to view the balance between sky and subject on the camera's screen and you can only get an accurate idea of what your image will look like if the camera's White Balance is set correctly.

Once we got composition, white balance, and exposure correct, we moved on to the actual light painting. Again, each flashlight is different and required a lot of experimenting to get exposure correct. We experimented with filters and gels over the flashlights. A soft, diffuse beam works better than a narrow beam.

Depending on the flashlight, we tried painting the subject for 10 to 30 seconds. We also tried painting the trees in the middle-ground. Finally, we placed some small flashlights inside or behind the subjects to illuminated them from within. We also used a large shed to act as a middle-ground and placed flashlights in it.

Participants practiced the necessary skills to produce their own light painting masterpieces. Thanks to everyone who participated.
