Best In Show: Star Trail At Fort Griffin, Texas By Wen-Chi

This image was taken in Fort Griffin State Historical Park at Albany Texas. In order to get the best star trails I selected a night with no moon. I used the following two sites:

Moon phase calendar to confirm a night with no moon: http://www.moonconnection.com/moon phases calendar.phtml

Best dark condition of the sky to capture the best star trails. http://www.observingsites.com/ds_tx.htm

The image was taken 01/28/2017 with an Olympus PEN-F and Fisheye 8mm F1.8 lens with the camera set to ISO 80 and F1.8. I used LIVECOMP (Live Composition) mode in the camera to capture a series of 113 exposure of 30 seconds duration. The light painting on the historical Administration Building was done during the 1st two exposures. The LIVECOMP accumulates light captured by each exposure and creates the final image internally. During the process, I can view the composed image via the live view screen. Once the star trail met my expectation, I pressed the shutter release again to stop LIVECOMP mode. The final raw image is created by camera. No additional stacking software tool was used. The post processing of image is completed by DXO OpticsPro and Photoshop.

Heard Nature Museum Contest

The Plano Photography Club was well represented in Advanced Adult Division of the Heard Nature Museum Annual Fund Raising Photo Contest. There were 723 images submitted in the contest this year.

Sharlott Hasty won Best of Show and 1st place in "captive animal" for her image <u>Horses at the Hideout Ranch.</u>
Sharlott also received 1st place in "birds" for her image <u>Great White Egret</u> and 2nd place for <u>Japanese Macaque</u> in the "animals wild" category.

Ron Marabito won 1st place in "scenics" for <u>Great Sand</u> <u>Dunes, Colorado.</u>

Dennis Fritsche's image <u>Sand on the Rio Grande</u> received 2nd place in the "abstractions in nature" category. Dennis also received 3rd place in "Creative Interpretation" for <u>Drinking Cactus juice</u> and an Honorable Mention in the "black and white" category for Ancient Bristle-cone Pine.

Larry Petterborg received 3rd place in "birds" for <u>Eastern Meadowlark</u>. Larry's image <u>Dragon Fly</u> was a 3rd place winner in the "insects, butterflys, and arachnids" category.

Ron Hasty's image <u>Orange Mountain Spring</u>, <u>Yellowstone</u> received an Honorable Mention in the "scenics" category.

Guest Speakers – "A Year On The Plate" – Starla Willis And Ann Lamb

A Year on the Plate, the Dallas County Master Gardener Cookbook, was created by a group of volunteers whose vision was to tell the story of incorporating edible plant material that grows in North Texas in delicious and enticing recipes, while educating the public on how to grow these same fruits, vegetables, herbs and more. The photography was accomplished almost entirely by two amateur photographers who love to garden and enjoy taking pictures. On a couple of rare occasions, professional photographers contributed to the effort.

We learned about plating, staging, lighting tricks, presentation, and color. Trial and error was our norm, and there were many, many sessions of narrowing down to the picture that would be the best selection. And if we didn't get "the one" in that session, we made the dish again and re-photographed. We were the cooks, the stylists, the editors, the critics and the cheerleaders. We continued to experience new challenges to be conquered before publication.

A Year on the Plate has been a huge undertaking that has taken our small committee to places we had no idea we would go. And we are better because of it. We hope you are able to savor the journey as we share our photographic experiences.











Competition Changes




