# **Best In Show: Two Mums By Nancy Mack**

My family and grandchildren reside in the far corners of the country, so I have chosen flowers - from my garden and the grocery store – for my inspiration. These mums were selected for their unusual colors. The first photos of the fresh flowers were interesting, but not "wow". I put them aside and was about to toss them when I realized they might provide some drama in their wilted state.

The photo was made with a Nikon 7100 and a Nikon 105mm 2.8 Macro lens set at ISO100, f5.6, 2.5 sec mounted on a tripod and tethered to a laptop running Helicon Remote. The background is a drape of black velvet lit by filtered light from a bay window. I exposed 10 images of the left flower and 8 images of the right flower. The images were then separately focus-stacked in Helicon Focus. The two results were imported into Lightroom and minimally processed. Both photos were exported to Photoshop to check for artifacts on the black background and composited as one photo using layers.

# Guest Speakers – "Compositing: Expand Your Creative Space" – Jim Christensen

Want to create images with more impact? Jim will demonstrate the power of compositing to completely change the mood of an image, and open-up your creative space to images that mix your imagination with your digital captures. He'll show examples and explain how to create them using Photoshop and filters from Topaz Labs. This talk will encourage you to imagine and create images with more impact.

Jim is a photographer, teacher, and speaker from the New York City area; a member and past president of the Westchester Photographic Society; founder of the annual Croton-on-Hudson Fall Arts Festival; and was the Artist in Residence at Acadia National Park in the spring of 2015. His work has been featured in galleries and other venues in NY and CT, and spans landscapes, night-scapes, wildlife, people (in the studio and on the sidewalks on NY), flowers, and abstracts. In addition he designs and builds one-of-a-kind mixed-media frames, and has a deep technical background in digital imaging theory and software as a result of his career as a research scientist at IBM were he created firmware and image processing software for one of the world's best (and first) digital colorimetric cameras (in the 1980's and 1990's). ## **Dennis Fritsche PSA Third Place Winner**

Dennis Fritsche's image, "Caddo Lake Rainbow", was awarded Third Place in the Photographic Society of America (PSA) Council's Challenge 2016 Color General competition. The image also won 1st place in the GSCCC Nature Projected Competition for November 2016. Congratulations!

According to Dennis "This photograph was made in January 2015 at Caddo Lake in far East Texas. Three of us hired a pontoon boat and guide to take us through the cypress forests to photograph wildlife and scenic. The leafless trees showed off the Spanish moss and tree shapes in the winter. We were in an area with vacation cabins and we came across this collection of brightly color chairs in the nearly colorless setting. I used a 70-200 f/4 lens at 200mm on a Nikon D810. The pontoon boat is fairly stable, but is always moving. I had the camera set to f/8, shutter speed of 1/320 second, -2 exposure compensation, and auto-ISO chose ISO 900. Minimal processing in Lightroom was required."


