#### Best In Show: Japanese Garden By Linda Grigsby

I took this photograph December 2016 mid-morning on a cloudy day at the Fort Worth Japanese Garden.

I used a Canon EOS 5D Mark III with a 16 - 35mm lens set at 35mm. The other settings were ISO - 200, F8, and 1/100. I first processed the photo in Lightroom and then did further edits in ON1 photo effects. In Photoshop I added a poster edge filter, a vignette, and a black border. I was fortunate that it was a cloudy day and that the fall colors were still in abundance.

## Guest Speakers - "Thunderbirds" -**Patrick Nugent**

Patrick Nugent will share his experiences working as a photojournalist with the United States Air Force, particularly his deployment with the Thunderbirds from January 1982 through July 1984. This was the first Thunderbirds team to fly the F-16 Falcon.

Senior Master Sergeant (Ret.) Patrick Nugent joined the Air Force wanting to become a jet engine mechanic, but he quickly found out that Air Force needs come first and he was sent to school to become a parachute rigger. Having a passion for photography, Nugent was able to cross-train to a new career field, enjoying assignments in Nebraska and Colorado before getting assigned to the Air Force's "Thunderbirds." That assignment led to a competitive selection as a photojournalist and resulted in advanced training at Syracuse University.

While stationed in Germany, Nugent covered the Rhein-Main Air Base bombing and the return of hostages Father Martin Jenco and David Jacobson, as well as those kidnapped from the Italian cruise ship "Achille Lauro." Nugent also covered Operations DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM, PROVIDE HOPE and the Panama invasion. He supervised the "Prototype" Electronic Imaging Center during the early and groundbreaking days that introduced digital photography to the Department of Defense.

Nugent retired in 1992 after 23 years of service and continues to participate in military photography workshops and the Military Photographer of the Year program. After retirement from military service, Nugent worked in marketing for both Kodak and Nikon. He is now fully retired and pursues his interests in Aviation, Landscape, Genealogy and personal photographic projects that involve past military assignments and organizations.



#### **President's Message: Sad News**

We are saddened by the news that Marlan, the husband of Marea Downey, passed away on May 29<sup>th</sup>, Memorial Day. He was memorialized at a private, family-only graveside service on Thursday, June 1<sup>st</sup>. Marlan was a distinguish scientist and engineer who worked at Shell Oil for 30 years in research and operations, serving as president of Shell Oil Company's international division, Pecten. He became the president of ARCO International and was past president of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG), a former Sarkeys Energy Center

Chief Scientist, and a past Bartell Geoscience Professor at the University of Oklahoma. Downey was also an elected fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and trustee of SMU's Institute for the Study of Earth and Man.

Marea is a distinguished member of our club and has contributed frequently through presentations, classes, lessons, and mentoring. In 2015-2016, she was awarded 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Masters Class and won Digital Image of the Year. The hearts and prayers of the club go out to Marea and the family.
