Best In Show: The Road Less Traveled By Danette Volkmer

This photo was taken late in the afternoon at the end of October during a vacation in NW Washington. While driving on the Mt. Baker Highway, shortly before Nooksack Falls, we passed the Nooksack River and turned around to stop and get a shot of the scene. After taking a few quick photos, we were walking back to the car when I spotted a small road parallel to the river which led into a still, quiet forest. Upon entering this forest sanctuary, we discovered that fall leaves, ferns and overgrown tree branches had covered the road and moss had overtaken the trees. The scene was almost magical, so we took a 30 minute break from our journey to shoot photos and enjoying the surrounding beauty. It was difficult to leave, but our goal was to get to Mt. Baker before sunset, so we pressed onward!

Details: Canon 5D Mark III, Canon 24-105 lens at 50 mm, 1/25, F11, ISO 1600, handheld. Processed with Adobe Camera Raw and edited in Photoshop.

The sky was over cast creating a giant soft box. It was a cold photo filled morning. I took pictures of the string of running horses then looked for a group of horses that were without merges.











