Edited in Lightroom and Photoshop CC. Details: Hand held Nikon D500, Sigma 150-600@150 mm, 1/1600 sec, f/8, EV +1, Auto ISO @ 560. White Balance cloudy, VR on, AF mode: AF-C. This camera shoots 10 fps and with this lens is a great, relatively lightweight combination for sports action and wildlife/bird photography.

## **Portfolios** - By Marea Downey

While I was looking through my copy of the July PSA (Photographic Society of America) Journal, I came across an article about a recent portfolio submission written by our very own Marea Downey. Portfolios are a collection of images organized around a theme presented to a panel of PSA members for evaluation. After reading Marea's description of the judging process, I thought I should ask her about her involvement with PSA and share her response with the members of the Plano Photography Club. Following then is Marea's essay on PSA and her role as a portfolio assessor. - Larry Petterborg, PSA Representative


I joined the Photographic Society of America in 2012. That year Erik Rosengren of PSA came to our club to give a presentation about being a judge for camera club competitions. He stayed at our house, and I took him out and about for photography of downtown Dallas, so I had the opportunity to talk further with him. He spoke highly of the benefits of being a member of PSA, and I was also intrigued by the possibility of studying to be a judge. I work with high school students to help them prepare their entries into the TAPPS annual art contest. I thought that learning how a judge would consider a picture would not only sharpen my own abilities to create an image, but also help me to help the students. I have judged camera club competitions for several years now, and that find the training course with PSA has been invaluable.

I have been to one of the Annual PSA conferences, which provide a great opportunity to get to know other photographers, attend presentations on different topics, and go on small field trips in the area where the conference is being held. I was also a Commentator with a PSA Study Group for some years, until personal circumstances deprived me of the time to continue this, at least for now.

I was asked to go through the training with PSA to become a portfolio assessor because PSA wanted to develop a program of awarding distinctions to photographers who submitted their portfolios for consideration at Bronze, Silver or Gold levels. As you may know, many other national societies around the world offer this kind of educational program. I submitted my portfolio to the Royal Photographic Society in England, in order to feel more qualified to judge the work of others in PSA's program. I was fortunate to gain the distinction of Licentiate with the Royal.

The creation of a portfolio is rather different from submitting a collection of images to a competition. The submission requires an Overview image, a Statement of Intent, and the collection of images that work well together as a panel, while still being individually artistically and technically correct. It is hoped that working to this goal will bring the photographer a high level of personal satisfaction in addition to the recognition that an award brings. It may even stretch one's artistic vision, utilizing one's technical skills in the medium to produce a powerful body of work. If a portfolio is not awarded a distinction it may be because of one aberrant photo, which could be replaced, and the portfolio resubmitted, or it could be that the assessors do not judge that the portfolio has achieved the required standard. We are all on a journey towards photographic excellence, so every assemblage of a portfolio should be regarded as good practice and worthwhile.

I do recommend to any photographer who wants to enjoy new photographic experiences, improve their skills, and make new friends through social interaction with like-minded photographers beyond Plano Photography Club, that they consider joining the Photographic Society of America.




