Best In Show: Clyde By Richard Otto

Attempting to photographically "corral" two baby German Pointers in the open can be a challenge. The initial result was multiple tumbling collisions and puppy butt shots! Weary, I escaped to the shade with their owner. Within minutes the male pup, Clyde, cuddled with the owner. I couldn't miss the chance to capture such a wonderfully calm (more likely exhausted!) expression.

I fired off a couple quick rounds in continuous mode. In Lightroom, I converted to a Low Key portrait by burning the background. The image was shot with a Sigma 105mm 1:2.8 DG lens on a Nikon D500 at 1/125 sec, f/8.0, ISO 125 settings.

Guest Speaker - How To Take Dynamic Environmental Portraits - Daniel Scott Arnauld

October 17th meeting:

Would you like to take better pictures without having to buy any new gear or having to be limited by a studio? Daniel Arnauld teaches tips and tricks for taking portraits of people outside and on location. This method of street photography is great for taking beginners to intermediary level, and for giving experts fresh ideas and powerful storytelling tools.

During his talk, Daniel will cover:

- Using natural light
- Seeing the city as opportunities for graphic design
- Letting the subject interact with the setting to spark creativity and collaboration
- Being ready for serendipity
- The difference between candid/journalistic street photography and a street portrait
- Best practices for working in the public

Daniel Arnauld is the founder of Street Photography University where he organizes workshops and teaches environmental portraits. He hires models and selects interesting neighborhoods for portrait photography. Daniel provides instructions in natural light, communication with the subject, and finding interests in the surroundings.

Daniel Arnauld is part of the north Texas photography community, photographing portraits and weddings and video production since earning his Bachelor's in Cinema from SMU in his home state of Texas. Daniel has traveled to over twelve countries and self published several children's books.

After starting Street Photography University, Daniel transformed the photography club into an educational program. Under his direction, the group is expanding into Fort Worth, McKinney and Denton: releasing a series of lessons on Dynamic Environmental Portraits: and is hosting advanced seminars this winter.

These experiences have led Daniel to lecture on the role of street photograph in both art and civic community. He shares his experience with the talented camera enthusiasts of North Texas and empowers them to see the city as an opportunity for creating dynamic portraits.





This another in a series of interviews with prominent club members.

Photography, especially photographing people, has been an passion since 3rd grade when my parents gave me a Kodak Brownie camera. I photographed my friends, and entered 4-H projects over the years. Photography became serious in the 1970's. I

found our small town had a camera club and attended workshops. I didn't connect with a photography club until I found PPC about 25 years ago. My wife, Lois, and I have been active in PPC and were co-presidents in 2000. I've taught a lot of classes here, mostly on portraiture and lighting. I am so happy that Lois and I both share a love of photography, although she is more interested in landscapes than people.

I grew up in Pontiac, Illinois, a small town of 10,000. I moved to Dallas 37 years ago. My other passion, historic preservation, began in Pontiac which is now a thriving "must see" destination for those on a pilgrimage along Route 66, the "Mother Road". I love photographing historic buildings, even abandoned ones.

I have one daughter, Dr. Jennifer Culver, who works at SMU. We have three grandchildren, the youngest is 16. We've been so fortunate to have them in our lives. They have been models for me (and the club) over the years, although sometime rather hesitantly.


I retired from active practice as a psychologist in 2016. Prior to retirement, I spent most of my practice evaluating professionals for fitness to work, including, law enforcement, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, etc. Since retirement, I've been a psychological consultant with the Texas Board of Nursing on a part-time basis.

My photography has always focused on people. I shoot some still life and landscape images, but nothing has held so much fascination as photographing people. A few years ago, I worked through Chris Orwig's book *Visual Poetry,* one I highly recommend. I wrote this artist statement about portraiture as part of the book's project: "A *good* portrait is one that captures at least a glimpse of the person within, the self behind the surface, and a *great* image also touches that same place in the viewer. "

I am a champion of family pictures and printing them too. A few years ago we photographed a friend's daughter for a senior picture. We also photographed her son, and family pictures that day. A few months later, her son, 10, was killed by a drunk driver. Those were the last images of him and were used at the funeral. A few years later, the mother was killed in a freak car crash. Those are the last images her daughter has of them together. Pictures are important.

I notice that this profile is much less about gear than the one done ten years ago. But here is a brief run down of my gear. As I have gotten older, I moved to lighter gear joining the Fuji mirrorless family. I have the XT3 and a variety of lenses. I really love mirrorless and would never go back to the DSLR. I have also trimmed down my lighting equipment. Lois and I have a full studio of lighting. Now, my lighting is much lighter, battery operated and allows me to also shoot with them outdoors. I very much enjoy studio work. Beyond portraiture, however, we have been very involved as volunteer photographers at Dallas Heritage Village, Farmer's Branch Historical Park, and for Habitat for Humanity (Greater Garland). Around Dallas, you are likely to find me in one of the historical parks, Hagerman NWR, or at Klyde Warren Park, one of my favorite places to create images.

The majority of my images are displayed on line on Flickr (just search for my name) and my website, www.thewizardofpixels.com. While I display some images on Instagram and some on my personal Facebook page, I have the most following on Flickr. I have over 4000 followers from around the world and my images have been viewed over 20 million times.

Now that we are both retired, Lois and I enjoy traveling for photography. The Southwest is our favorite place to be, and we will likely be heading to Sedona again shortly. I also love to collect vintage images from the early years of photography (1850's-1900), and a few vintage cameras.

I read a quote recently that sums up the role of photography in my life: "It's amazing the number of great people in my life that I wouldn't have ever met if it wasn't for photography" That includes a lot of people on both sides of the camera, and those in PPC are an important part of that.



Speeding Up Lightroom

First, I trust you all know how to Optimize Catalog (under File). I do this in reverse when I close Lightroom. I "back up catalog: every time Lightroom exits" and include "optimize catalog after backing up". Optimize catalog will improve performance albeit small.

In the most recent update to Lightroom Classic there are a couple of changes that you can make that will speed up LR. Starting with PC Ctrl+"," (Mac Cmd+",") which will open Preferences\Performance. At the top, change Use Graphics Processor from "Auto" to "Custom". Then select below, "Use GPU for image processing". This results in "Full graphics acceleration is enabled". Not all GPU support this.

Next, make sure you are using the fastest drive possible for your catalog. Now, go back to Preferences\ Performance and increase your Camera Raw Cache Settings to Maximum Size to 100 GB.

My experience has shown overall speed improvement from these changes. One example is Publish Services. Previously, uploading was a "Publish Now" command followed by a lunch break. Now, it is "Publish Now" and a quick cup of coffee and you are done.

Fearful to change your settings? Use screen capture and take a picture (we are photographers after all) before you make the changes. You can always reset.
